Ready mix concrete weights 4,000+ pounds per cubic yard.


Concrete pumps are placing the concrete anywhere from 10 to more than 100 cubic yards per hour.




For truck-mounted boom pumps that can reach more than 200 feet, outrigger ground pressures exceed 100,000 LBF.


